**REPATRIATION UPDATE #10 – 1300 hrs AWST 30 June 2010**

---

Sundance Resources Limited (**ASX: SDL** – "Sundance" or "the Company") would like to provide the following update on the status of activities associated with the repatriation of personnel from Brazzaville in the Republic of Congo, following the air crash on 19 June 2010.

**Wednesday 30 June 2010:****Brazzaville, Republic of Congo**

The Company has continued to work in close cooperation with the Australian Federal Police, the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, and the Congolese authorities to ensure an appropriate and dignified process is followed to effect repatriation in a timely manner.

The formal identification process which commenced on Sunday 28 June 2010 has continued over the last few days. This work is being carried out by a specialist identification team from the Australian Federal Police.

At this point in time, it is not known when the formal identification process will be concluded.

**Repatriation**

At the same time, Sundance has been working with a specialist repatriation contractor (NetCare) to put in place the logistical and other arrangements for repatriation, including travel routes and escorts.

Current plans are for the deceased to be transported from Brazzaville to Paris via Air France and on to home countries. The Australian deceased will be transported with Qantas to home states.

At this point and subject to confirmation of the above travel arrangements and other processes, it is our expectation that repatriation to Australia and other home nations will take place by mid-July 2010.

**Condolence Ceremony**

The Republic of Congo is planning a small official condolence ceremony in Brazzaville prior to repatriation.

Sundance Strategic Advisor and former Chairman George Jones along with fellow Strategic Advisor Michael Blakiston will be travelling to Brazzaville to attend the condolence ceremony and escort the deceased back to Australia.

## Public Memorials

A public memorial for those Western Australian's lost will be held in Perth late next week. The Memorial is being organised by the Association of Mining and Exploration Companies (AMEC) with support from member companies, including Sundance Resources.

Further details will be advertised separately once the date has been confirmed with the families.

A public memorial for John Carr-Gregg is being held in Sydney at 1100 (AEST) on Tuesday 6 July 2010 at St John's Anglican Church in Gordon (cnr Pacific Highway and St John's Avenue).

## Investigation

The air crash investigation is being coordinated by the Congolese authorities with assistance from the US National Transport Safety Bureau and the equivalent French agency (the Bureau d'Enquetes et d'Analysis).

Sundance would like to reiterate its strong appreciation for the support of the Congolese and Cameroon Governments, and the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade throughout the recovery and repatriation process along with the assistance and cooperation of the French, US, and British Governments.

Sundance continues to offer its full support to the families and is providing families with regular updates on the repatriation activities.

Further media updates regarding the repatriation process will be provided as further substantive information is confirmed.
